

**Appendix: Georgia State University (GSU) MS in Health Sciences with a  
concentration in Nutrition Program with  
Taipei Medical University (TMU)**

This document lists the requirements and expectations of students wishing to enter the MS in Health Sciences with a concentration in Nutrition program at GSU. This document is meant to supplement the overarching agreement between the GSU and TMU.

Number of students:

Starting in the Fall 2017 semester, a maximum of five (5) new students from TMU may enroll each Fall semester in the MS in Health Sciences concentration in Nutrition program at GSU.

The following pre-requisites must be met prior to enrolling at GSU:

- Completed the following course pre-requisites
  - Inorganic Chemistry – GSU CHEM 1211K and CHEM 1212K or TMU General Chemistry + General Chemistry Laboratory or equivalent
  - Organic Chemistry – GSU CHEM 2400 and CHEM 3100 or TMU Organic Chemistry + Organic Chemistry Laboratory or equivalent
  - Human Anatomy and Physiology 1 – GSU BIOL 2110K or GSU BIOL 2107K and BIOL 2108K or TMU Anatomy + Anatomy Laboratory or equivalent
  - Human Anatomy and Physiology 2 – GSU BIOL 2120K or GSU BIOL 3240 and BIOL 3250 or TMU Physiology + Physiology Laboratory or equivalent
  - Principles of Nutrition – GSU NUTR 2100 or TMU Nutrition or equivalent\*
  - Macronutrients – GSU NUTR 6500 or TMU Nutrition or equivalent
  - Micronutrients – GSU NUTR 6700 or TMU Nutrition or equivalent
- An overall GPA of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale)
- A TOEFL iBT (minimum 79/120) or IELTS (minimum 6.5/9)
- Two letters of recommendation and a career statement as part of the completed online application
- TMU students admitted to GSU will also take the GSTEP (Georgia State Test of English Proficiency) upon arrival

\*NOTE: TMU students must successfully complete a 1-credit GSU NUTR 7990 course prior to or in the first semester the MS in Health Sciences with a concentration in Nutrition Program to fulfill all pre-requisite requirements for Principles of Nutrition.

The following requirements for the MS degree must be met during the time at GSU:

- A minimum of an additional 27 credits earned while in the graduate program after transferring up to 9 credits from TMU, for a total of 36 credits
- A minimum of 6 capstone credits (included in the total 36 credits)
- A cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) during the graduate program
- All other degree requirements
